

### **Purpose**

- To Provide a Direct Connection Between Sunrise Manor and the City of Henderson
- To Link the primarily Residential Sunrise Manor to the commercial and employment areas of Henderson
- To Improve Recreational Access to the Wetlands Park

- Alternative to the I-515 Freeway and Boulder Highway








# Wildlife Management Plan Threatened and Endangered Bird Surveys

#### Marsh birds/Yuma Ridgway's rail (YRRA)

- Surveys take place in April–May
- 6 individuals counted in 2023
  - o 7 in 2022
  - o 5 in 2021
  - All other years 0 or 1





# Wildlife Management Plan

## Threatened and Endangered Bird Surveys

### Southwestern willow flycatcher (SWFL)

- Surveys conducted May–June, territory monitoring continued into August
- Record 3 territories, 2 with pairs:
  - 6 nest attempts, I was successful
  - 3 nestlings were banded at 7.5–9-days old
  - o I, the youngest, confirmed as fledging






# Wildlife Management Plan Threatened and Endangered Bird Surveys

#### Yellow-billed cuckoo (YBCU)

- Surveys conducted June–August
- o Record 11 detections in 2023
  - 5 individuals
  - 2 probable breeding territories
    - Probable territory = 3 or more detections in roughly the same area, each separated by at least 10 days





# Wildlife Management Plan Threatened and Endangered Bird Surveys

- The increase in detections/breeding records requires new ESA compliance coverage for LTOP activities
  - Section 7 consultation for Reclamation lands/funding for the three listed birds and monarch (candidate) - BA submitted to FWS in August
  - SNWA is working with Clark County on section 10 process for YRRA, which is not covered by the MSHCP (SWFL & YBCU are)







# WMP Avian Point Count Study

- Biweekly counts by GBBO
- 146 species detected in 2021/22 study year (Sept-Aug); 2022/23 study year data under analysis
- o 2005–2022
  - o 247 species
- 2005–2021 and 2005–2022 reports are back with GBBO for edits
- Reports document significant increases in richness and abundance
- Began alternating years in Sept; off in 2023/24

Figures show seasonal changes in number of species and individuals detected in the early (2005–2011) versus late (2014–2022) period









# Wildlife Management Plan Small Mammal & Shrew Surveys

- o Small mammals:
  - Sherman live traps
- o Shrews
  - Drift fence and pitfall traps
- Surveys are conducted at 6 mesquite woodland and riparian sites
  - Surveys conducted monthly from March to November in 2023
  - o 9 species documented:
    - Western harvest mouse
    - Cactus mouse
    - Brush mouse
    - House mouse

- Desert woodrat
- Black rat
- Desert pocket mouse
- Merriam's kangaroo rat
- Round-tailed ground squirrel

## Bat Surveys – Acoustic Monitoring

- o3 stations deployed 1/9/23
- oBetween DU1/DU2 North
  - OMoved to Nature Preserve
- oPabco South
  - Tree uprooted during flash floods
- **OHistoric Lateral Expansion North**

Surveys will continue until December 2024









# Wildlife Management Plan

## Bat Surveys – Mist Netting

#### White-nose Syndrome (WNS) Surveys

- April–May
- 23 individuals captured
  - 23 bat swabs
  - 11 environmental swabs
  - 13 guano samples

All samples came back negative for WNS!

All samples collected in NV were negative!

#### **Mist Netting**

- May–June
  - 5 survey nights
- 12 bats captured (same bats as WNS)
- Paused in June to avoid potential incidental take
- Surveys rescheduled for 2024



## Revegetation

- More than 615 acres have been revegetated
- 2022 vegetation monitoring report under internal review
- 2021 vegetation monitoring report is complete
  - Of 78 sites monitored in the field
    - 49 had cover that stayed the same
    - 12 increased in cover
    - 12 decreased in cover
- Long-term revegetation management plan implementation
  - Additional plantings
  - Enhancements for wildlife







# **Grant Funding**Bureau of Reclamation



- \$255,000 in funding added for FY23
  - Revegetation, water quality monitoring, wildlife management plan implementation and LVWCC program management
- \$900,500 restoration grant
  - Downstream Pabco area
  - Staff is working with a design firm and engineering
  - Remove gravel sediment and restore riparian trees

#### Approved the Las Vegas Wash FY 2024/2025 LTOP budget

- Budget tracked monthly by category
- Stabilization O&M deferred for two years while incidental take coverage is sought for federally listed bird species
- \$300k reserve amount in the LTOP has been funded by unused dollars from FY2022/23 from non-stabilization programs
- Total operating budget: \$2,706,542
  - Estimated Bureau of Reclamation contribution + other grants: \$289,750
  - Coal contribution: \$2,416,792
- Budget received unanimous approval

#### 03

#### Received update on 2022/23 accomplishments of the LVWCC

- Working on 24/25 stabilization O&M contract; flooding damage from monsoons but facilities held up well and limited extent
- Monitored water quality; selenium continued to be low at most sites
- Record threatened & endangered bird activity; reinitiated consultation with FWS through Reclamation and worked with County on coverage for the rail
- Revegetated 13.5 acres at two Wash Green-Ups; tamarisk down 99%
- Cultural concerns to be addressed on project-by-project basis
- Continued public outreach; ~12,500 people attended events

#### Received update on Lower Las Vegas Wash

- Weir 5 design is 100% complete; Weirs 6–8 are at 30% design; and Weir 9 design has not begun
- Received 404 permit from the US Army Corps
- Permits pending for Groundwater Discharge and Working in Waterways (NDEP)
- Las Vegas Paving awarded CMAR (Construction Manager at Risk)
- Staff anticipate construction of Weir 5 to begin in spring 2024

#### Received update on the Clark County Wetlands Park

- Wetlands Park experienced significant flooding in late summer
- Office of Public Safety was created in 2022 and supports the Wetlands Park
- Invasive Australian redclaw crayfish was discovered and removed from ponds by NDOW
- Submitting proposal for SNPLMA funding for Dragonfly Wetland Interpretation Area and Duck Creek Event Area
- CS Loop Trail project; Phase One to be completed in December 2024
- Wetlands Park programs, field trips and events are in full swing
- The Nature Gallery opened to the public on July 22

#### Received update on regional water quality

- 🗷 Lake Mead surface elevation increased; predictions for year-end are 1,067 ft
- Chlorophyll concentrations in the lake have stayed low over the past 20 years
- Storms in late summer caused some short-term changes in algal toxin levels
- Continued modeling Lake Mead WQ predictions for intakes/treatment impact
- **Current projects:** 
  - Study increases in flowrate of the Wash on Lake Mead drinking WQ through 2060
  - Investigate how phytoplankton dynamics may be shifting in the lake
  - Quantitative microbial risk assessment model for the Las Vegas Valley
